

# Announcements

## Club 2018 rate structure

It is hard to believe, but the basic club membership fee has been \$20 for twenty years.

We're fortunate that we have a good team managing our expenses while providing ever expanding services to members. I think back to the 90s where the idea of GPS enabled routes, online membership payments, and internet social networking to keep us in touch could hardly be imagined. But alas our costs are starting to catch up with us.

We have had a 38% increase in insurance costs over the past 3 years, renewal for our web hosting is due, we need to replace aging special events equipment, as well as increases in venue costs for dinners and events.

So with extensive discussion, and some level of reluctance, the board voted to approve increasing individual membership from \$20 to \$25 (individual member), and family membership from \$25 to \$35 (two adult family members at same address and dependents under 18 up to 5 members).

Although family level has gone up more, it is still a bargain as it saves a couple \$15 over individual membership rates. The new rates will go into effect on Nov 1 2017, which is the beginning of the club's 2018 fiscal year.

We certainly hope that you find this information useful and as always, appreciate everyone's participation. See you out on the rides.

## **September Report**

**Brad Jensen**

The season will be winding down for most of us as you read this. After a cold wet spring we deserve a mild fall to continue to rack up more riding. As of September 10th there have been 246 reported rides and another thirty-two scheduled rides that had no riders. Twenty-two ride sheets are outstanding. A total of 3049 riders, consisting of 445 individuals, have so far accumulated 99,240 miles. A summary didn't get done in Sept. 2016, so I can't give an accurate comparison, although I'm sure the numbers are still down. However, they are on par with the stats from Sept 2015.

Participating riders have so far averaged 6.8 rides and 223 miles. Each non-rainout has averaged 12.4 riders. Ninety-nine people have done 10 or more rides and 43 people have done 20 or more rides. Sixty-three people have over 500 club miles and 24 have hit the 1000 mile mark. Eight more riders are within 100 miles of the 1000 mile mark. So far this year we have had 169 first time riders, of whom 68 are new members.

So far this season we have had 46 rides with 20 or more riders. There have been four rides with 30 or more riders since the last report.



## *Board Meeting Minutes*



### **Rochester Bicycling Club Board of Directors Regular Meeting: August 14, 2017**

Present: Brad Jensen, Mark Robbins, Dana Black, Bill Lebbon, Richard DeSarra, Steve Lee, Todd Calvin, Nancy Rohlin, Paul Knerr.

The meeting was called to order at 6:39pm by President Brad Jensen.

The minutes of the previous board meeting on June 10<sup>th</sup> were approved.

**Challenge Ride:** 74 people attended the event; many were new faces. We spent \$350 on this event. General comments were favorable concerning the new site and ride routes.

**50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary:** Committee meeting is scheduled for September. We need a \$100 deposit for the venue. Plan is to combine this event with the Volunteer Dinner in November. The 50<sup>th</sup> Committee generated several ideas.

**RBC Sponsorship of Rochester Criterium:** The board proposed that \$500 be given to the Rochester Twilight Criterium as a sponsorship. An E-vote was conducted on July 10-12. Nine voted yes, zero voted no. This expenditure was approved.

**Jerseys:** The jersey order was received in June. Back orders were filled.

**RBC Tent at Criterium:** Brad and Nancy will coordinate volunteers for this event.

**RBC Canopy Replacement:** The RBC canopy is more than 10 years old. The board started to look into replacing it. Brad brought literature from a company, EZ-Up. We will target January 2018 to select and order a replacement.
