### *A Tribute to Jerry Vogt*

Jerry Vogt passed away on November 21 due to complications from a cycling accident which left him with a C4-C5 spinal injury. He was on club rides for many years, riding a recumbent. He posted numerous "day rides," and attendees enjoyed the comradery and socialization that came with his more leisurely riding style.

At his memorial service, family and friends shared many stories that illustrated Jerry's spirit, attitudes, and incredible faith.

His sister Rosemary shared many colorful stories from his childhood. As a child, "he wasn't Jerry, he was Buzzy; apparently when he was little, he buzzed around a lot." His parents "emphasized faith first and foremost; they encouraged us to read and expected us to do well in school; and they instilled in us an appreciation of classical music. All those are recurring themes in his life."

If something needed to be done, Jerry figured out how to do it. As a teen, his room was in the attic. "He rigged an indoor intercom for the family that involved a buzzer that rang in his room; as I recall, we'd buzz him, dial one digit on the phone to get rid of the dial tone and he'd pick up a handset upstairs to talk on the open line. He built a similar outdoor system into the old icebox on the back of the house."

His entrepreneurial tendencies were there early on. "He was always interested in printing and printing presses" and received a toy printing press as a little kid. He eventually graduated to a real one, spent a lot of time talking to a guy who owned a printing shop, and later was offered a real press if he could pay for delivery to his garage. "Jerry worked for the man while he took a two-year electronics program at Jefferson High School, all the while learning the ropes of running a business. He later took electrical engineering courses at RIT as well."

"In his teens, Jerry studied for his ham radio operator's license, part of which entailed learning the Morse Code that came in so handy in the ICU. He met a man named Bill at a meeting of amateur radio operators" and Bill had a daughter named Joan. With Joan, it was "first friendship, then love, then marriage, and madly in love still after 53 ½ years."

Jerry was hired as a technical writer at R. F. Communications, which produced radio frequency communications equipment. Later he worked in the engineering department and at Scientific Radio Systems.

"He also began to design products to sell to ham radio operators. One of his marketing strategies was to submit articles he wrote about his products to a magazine that catered to hams agreeing to forgo the stipend for the articles if he was allowed to indicate that the items were available for sale. Soon, Hamtronics was incorporated. Jerry designed the products outside his regular work hours and Joan worked part-time on shipping, billing, and bookkeeping. When the business generated a consistent enough income to live on and there was too little time left over to design new products, he quit his job and they both worked full-time for Hamtronics."


"Little by little, the business took over more of the space of the house. First to go was the dining room and he converted the garage to office space as well. Eventually Jerry decided he even needed to move the bedroom upstairs. I stopped to visit during the process and saw a gaping hole in the outer wall of the house. He was raising the roof, all by himself. I asked him in astonishment how he knew what to do. He said he went to the library and got a couple of books on it. But that was his attitude; he figured that if someone could do something, then he could do it."

"Outside of the business, Jerry loved singing in the choir. He was active in other church activities as well, including participating in the resettlement of a group of Sudanese walking boys. He was a volunteer firefighter for over ten years. And of course, he loved biking with his friends, working in his garden, and his cat Lily."

A friend described how Jerry's life changed in an instant when riding with friends in October 2016. "The next six months were a wild roller coaster ride with many setbacks. Jerry never complained, never gave up and was always willing to go for it." He was always hopeful he would get better. "I've never seen anyone with such commitment to his physical therapy. He'd do his exercises throughout the day. I remember his delight in showing everyone how he could raise his shoulders up and down and later wiggle his toes. Jerry's faith never wavered. He never got mad or lost faith in God." In April 2017 he moved to Unity Transitional Care, and in July 2017, Jerry finally got to go home. His return home was not without setbacks, and he returned to the hospital three times with bouts of pneumonia. In November, Jerry became ill again but at that time stated that he was "ready to let go." On November 21, he "went home to be with the Lord."

## ***2017 Final Ride Stats***

### **2017 Final Ride Stats Report**

**Brad Jensen**

For all of 2017 there were 334 reported rides, and 42 scheduled rides with no riders or no ride log returned. A total of 3,793 riders, consisting of 470 individuals, accumulated 124,681 total miles. Participating riders averaged 8.1 rides and 265 miles. Each non-rain-out averaged 11.4 riders. We had 51 rides with 20 or more riders.

Over-all participation, based on several statistics was down about 10% compared to last year. Looking at the monthly stats we were down in March, May and June. The rest of the season we were even or up compared to 2016. This past year was close to the previous 5 year averages for most statistics that I keep. We just got off to a slow start last spring due to the weather and never caught up.

Sixty-one people did 20 or more rides and seventeen people did 40 or more rides. Seventy-eight people rode over 500 miles, thirty-nine people rode over 1000 club miles and seven people reached the 2000 or more milestone.

There are 119 people who have ridden with the club in each of the last 5 years, and 69 people who have ridden with the club in each of the last 10 years.

This year I started keeping track of whether or not riders are members. A total of 201 non-members rode a total of 12,856 club miles. We had 215 first time riders this past year. Of those, 63% were non-members. There were 149 people who did only 1 ride with the RBC this past year. Of those, 67% were non-members. From the 515 people who did at least 1 ride last year, 241 did not ride this year, 73% of those were non-members.

Added rides, found only on Meetup, account for a significant part of the club's offering. There were 131 added rides scheduled with 170 individuals who rode a total of 20,407 miles or 16% of the total miles. Two new ride leaders, Dave Ennis and Will Haines, accounted for 48 of the Added rides. S&E rides also remain popular segment of our ride calendar. There were 51 S&E rides with 178 individuals who rode a total of 12,269 miles or 9.8% of the total.






